

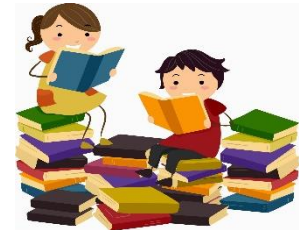
## Useful websites to help your child: Reading
